2019 Summer Explorations

WHAT: Summer Explorations is a series of single week programs offered by the Harvard Ed Portal for students entering 1st-10th grade in the coming fall. Each individual program explores a different subject area and a student can apply for as many programs within their grade range as they would like. Space is limited and varied among the programs and therefore the Ed Portal cannot guarantee entrance into all programs for every applicant. Please see the below descriptions of programs organized by grade cluster and date.

Entering Grades 1-2

Literacy: July 8–12 | 9:00am–noon

Calling all rising first and second graders to enjoy a week of poetry and creation at the Harvard Ed Portal! Participants will read, write, and create in response to poetry relating to their summer experiences and identities. Who are you and what does summer look like in your life?

American Repertory Theater: July 15–19 9:00am–noon

A.R.T. Kids Company Jamboree is a theater program for students entering grades 1-2 that unites STEM learning with creative play. Each day, we start with an established children's story and use improv games, creative play techniques, and craft projects to act out the story LIVE!

HMNH*: Space! July 22–25 9:30am–noon

How do we explore beyond planet Earth? Experiment with making craters, sending up rockets, and celebrate the 50th anniversary of Apollo 11 Moon landing. Meet scientists and learn how they are studying the moon and other planets.

Athletics: Boys' Youth Basketball Academy: August 5–7 | 9:00am–3:00pm

Students must be 7 years old by the start of the program. The 2019 Youth Basketball Academy will give participants the opportunity to work on improving their overall basketball skill set in a positive and constructive environment. Players will work on developing their individual and teamwork skills through station work and apply these skills during team game play each day of the Academy. Participants will work directly with the Harvard Basketball coaching staff and players from the current team.

Athletics: Girls' Crimson Soccer School Youth Clinic: August 5–9 | 9:00am–3:00pm

Students must be 6 years old by the start of the program. Harvard's experienced coaching staff will lead a developmental clinic with the emphasis on skill instruction in a fun environment. Current and former Harvard University soccer players will support our coaching staff as counselors and act as great role models for younger players. Players will gain an insight into what it takes to play soccer at the highest level, both on the field and in the classroom.

Entering Grades 3-5

HMNH*: Time Travelers - Viajeros en el Tiempo: July 8–12 | 9:30am–noon

Explore the daily life of the ancient Maya people through hands-on activities with hieroglyphs, clay, food, outdoor games and some surprises. Learn a little Spanish and become a magnificent Mesoamerican for a week.

Science of Cooking: July 15–19 9:00am–noon

Do you love to cook and try new foods? Explore science and mathematics skills in the context of food and cooking while thinking about nutrition and healthy lifestyles. Students will learn food preparation, recipe reading and cooking skills and enjoy the fruits of their labor each day!

Scratch And Root Robotics: July 22–26 9:00am–noon

Learn to code with Scratch and robots! Students will develop their coding skills by creating their own games and stories in Scratch. After gaining experience with Scratch, students will practice programming Root, a robot that can draw, climb, play music, and more. This weeklong program is a great opportunity for students to establish a programming mindset and use coding skills in creative ways.

Athletics: Strength and Conditioning Clinic Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday Offered every week from July 8–29 9:00am–11:00am

Students must be 10 years old by the start of the program. The Athletes will receive instruction by professional performance staff, proper lifting technique, proper running mechanics and agility training. Each training session will begin with a warm-up and then proceed to 45 minutes of speed and agility training, 45-50 minutes of strength training, and 25-30 minutes of conditioning. Athletes will receive the same training that has been used with many collegiate and professional athletes, which will help to give them an edge over their competition.

Entering Grades 6-8

Hands-on Sustainability: July 8–12 9:00am–noon

Middle school students will learn how to repair a number of household items such as appliances, cell phones, bicycles and learn how to create space for garden planting in their homes. This workshop is based on the “Fixit Clinic” model of teaching sustainability through repair. Students will learn how to make the repairs so that they may encourage their friends and families to think twice before throwing away something that has broken. No experience or tools required; only a willingness to learn!

Athletics: Strength and Conditioning Clinic: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday Offered every week from July 8–29 9:00am–11:00am

Students must be 10 years old by the start of the program. The Athletes will receive instruction by professional performance staff, proper lifting technique, proper running mechanics and agility training. Each training session will begin with a warm-up and then proceed to 45 minutes of speed and agility training, 45-50 minutes of strength training, and 25-30 minutes of conditioning. Athletes will receive the same training that has been used with many collegiate and professional athletes, which will help to give them an edge over their competition.

3D Printing: July 15–19 | 9:00am–noon

Design and print your own 3D creations! In this weeklong program, students will learn how to build 3D models using CAD software and use 3D printers effectively. They will then watch their creations come to life on 3D printers at the Harvard Innovation Lab! This is a perfect program for makers, coders, and designers who want a hands-on learning experience.

ThinkerAnalytix and the Harvard Department of Philosophy have developed materials to teach students how make and evaluate arguments. Our summer interns will help us design materials for civics classes using The Declaration of Independence as our central text. Our goal is to have interns create and critique content, including videos, graphics and learning strategies so our materials engage and enrich a broad audience of high school students. Students will need to complete a secondary application and participants will earn \$100 for four days of intern work.
