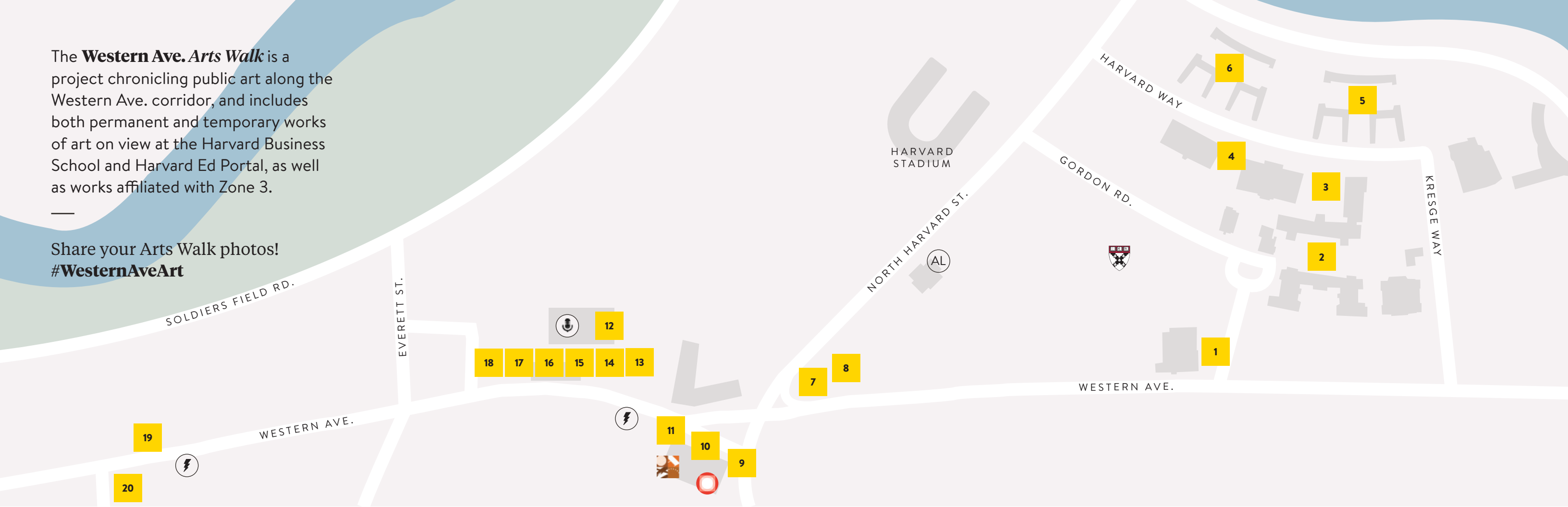

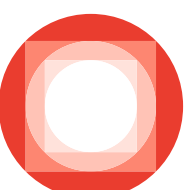

1 Digital DNA

- Adriana Varella & Nilton Maltz
- Digital DNA is a seven-foot-tall egg-shaped sculpture made of printed circuit boards on fiberglass and styrofoam by artists Adriana Varella and Nilton Maltz.

2 Exhibition supported by C. Ludens Ringnes Sculpture Collection

- This annual sculpture exhibition on HBS's Schwartz Common is made possible by support from the C. Ludens Ringnes Sculpture Collection.

3 Inés

Jaume Plensa

- Jaume Plensa's *Inés* has been on view at Harvard Business School since 2016. In 2018, it became part of the permanent collection.

4 Untitled

Joel Shapiro

- Joel Shapiro's large bronze sculpture *Untitled* engages with the surrounding architecture and landscape and is a dynamic arrangement of rectangular forms that recalls figures moving in space.

5 Search

John Safer

- Search*, a 20 foot-high bronze by artist John Safer, is about the search for knowledge. Its curved form reaches up toward the sky, symbolizing there is always more to discover.

6 Presence

Mary Frank

- Presence*, a large bronze sculpture of a woman's head, was installed at Harvard Business School in 1989, by sculptor, painter, photographer, and ceramic artist, Mary Frank.

7 Shadows of Barry's Corner

Ross Miller

- Urban park lighting with a series of full spectrum LED fixtures mounted within the trees lights the walkways and the natural landscape with color sequences composed for each season.

8 WE ALL

- ongoing
- A vibrantly colored wall comprised of hundreds of plexiglass tubes that illuminate at night to create a lively and dynamic atmosphere.

9 The Allston Palate

Mural Club teachers and students

- May 2019–April 2020
- The Mural Wall features student work from the Ed Portal's 2018 Mural Club, led by HGSE alumna and street artist IMAGINE (aka Sneha Shrestha) and HGSE student Sara van der Horst.

10 Crossings Gallery

The Harvard Ed Portal's Crossings Gallery displays work by Harvard and Allston-Brighton artists.

11 Gallery 224

- Gallery 224, part of the Ceramics Program-Office for the Arts at Harvard, engages the public with exhibitions that showcase the work of emerging and established ceramic artists, research through academic collaboration, and the talent within their studio community.

12 PRX Podcast Garage Mural

Meredith Mendosa, Kenji Nakayama

- ongoing
- The PRX Podcast Garage's logo was designed by Meredith Mendosa and hand-lettered by Kenji Nakayama, who also conceptualized and painted this mural.

13 Art in Print at Zone 3

ongoing

- Zone 3's Art in Print program is designed to make buying art accessible. Newspaper bins in the neighborhood contain limited-release works by local artists, available for 25¢ each.

14 Zone 3

Madeline Jacobson, Kenji Nakayama

- ongoing
- Using repetitive patterns derived from the Zone 3 logo, designer Madeline Jacobson and sign painter Kenji Nakayama collaborated on this sharp geometric backdrop for Zone 3's hub of activity.

15 Faces of Allston

Pete Cosmos

- ongoing
- The characters in Allston resident Pete Cosmos' mural, the first under Zone 3's Walls on Western program, represent Allston's history, establishments, and its most popular clichés.

16 All that Empty Space

Chris Delorenzo

- ongoing
- Designer and illustrator Delorenzo completed *All That Empty Space*, the third mural in the Walls on Western series, in August 2018 following a community vote on the design.

17 Soya Patri

(One with a Hundred Petals)

IMAGINE (Sneha Shrestha)

- ongoing
- Boston-based artist IMAGINE painted *Soya Patri (One with a Hundred Petals)* in May 2018 as the second piece in the Walls on Western series.

18 Allumination

Jessie + Katey

- ongoing
- Artist duo Jessie + Katey turned an entire building into a bright art installation made of paint and recycled materials.

19 Evo

David Teng Olsen

- ongoing
- This 170 ft. long mural was inspired by people in the neighborhood who shared their stories with Olsen during his Allston residency.

20 Look up, Allston!

Ross Miller and local high school students

- April–October 2019
- Under the direction of local artist and Harvard alumnus Ross Miller, local high school students in the Ed Portal program *Look up, Allston!* painted these street banners.
